

Flickr Project

1. Start by visiting www.Flickr.com. We will need to sign up. If you already have a Yahoo or Google account, you may use this. If you do not, we will need to sign up for one. Fill in all of your appropriate information.
2. Once signed in, we will need to upload pictures. We will use the same pictures that we used earlier for Prezi. At the top of the screen, click on **Upload**. Then, click **Choose Photos and Videos**. Click on the six photos we saved earlier. You can hit CTRL and click on each picture to highlight them all. Then click open. Click on private for your privacy setting. Then, hit **Upload Photos and Videos**. It will take a couple minutes for them to upload.
3. When they're all done, it will say "Finished! Next: add a description perhaps?" Click on that so we can help describe our photos. From here, you can change the title, add a description, or tag your photos. Tagging your photos will help to organize based upon name. For each of these pictures, use the tag **Boston**. Add a brief description to each as well. When finished, click **Save**.
4. Now, we'll want to organize these even better so it's easier to navigate as you add more pictures. At the top of the page, click on **Organize & Create**. Scroll down to **Your Sets**. You will see your photos down at the bottom. Click each one and drag it to the large box. Change the name from "new set" to "Boston." When finished, click the Flickr icon in the upper right hand corner to go back to the home page.
5. Now, to see your photographs in a slideshow, from the home page, click on **Your Photostream**. In the upper-right, you will see a button that says **Slideshow**. Click that so you can see your slideshow in action. From your slideshow, you can click the **Share** button to find a link to your slideshow. There is even an option to send a link to your email address.

You may log back in from any computer to access your pictures. You may add more pictures on at anytime. It's a great place to help create slideshows of special events to share with your class!
